REFLECTIONS ON CHANGE

The Calgary Zoo offers every visitor something unique, and last year, close to 1.2 million visitors came to the zoo to experience the world through our collection of plants and animals. They had the chance to explore beyond the everyday—to enjoy all the experiences we offer, including the outstanding botanical gardens, the exceptional animal displays exemplifying the highest quality of animal care, and some of the best and most successful events ever realized by the zoo.

Annual Pass and Discovery Passport memberships increased in 2007, reflecting that community support for our organization equals the zoo's dedication to the community. The Calgary Zoo is proud to be a leader in providing a resource for conservation, education, research and recreation in the community—the foundation of our mission statement. More than ever, Calgarians are turning to the Calgary Zoo to discover, explore and connect with nature.

Another significant change this year came at the leadership level when we welcomed a new President and CEO to the Calgary Zoo, Dr. Clément Lanthier. Formerly the director of animal care and live collections, Dr. Lanthier brings his strong veterinary background to his new role, coupled with an MBA, making him an excellent choice to lead our zoo. This new balance of skills and experience, along with his vision for enhanced visitor enjoyment and a commitment to conservation, are aspects that will positively change the face of the Calgary Zoo for years to come.

As well, 2007 marked the official opening of Elephant Crossing, the new home for our Asian elephants. This facility offers visitors unique opportunities to observe our elephants in a new light and

offers us the ability to add more enrichment to their expanded environment over time. During the year we also reached out to connect with other community partners and environmental leaders, announcing our partnership to build the new ENMAX Conservatory. With construction set to begin in late 2008, the new ENMAX Conservatory will keep many of the features Calgarians have historically come to appreciate and expect—such as the amazing plant collection and the butterfly garden—but will also include many innovative and technically advanced energy systems.

We've also made significant strides in the area of scientific research. Our contribution to the Vancouver Island marmot recovery program was identified by the Association of Zoos and Aquariums as one of North America's Top 10 Conservation Success Stories in 2007. Brian Keating and his team in the Conservation Outreach department ensured Calgarians, and others around the globe, have an increased understanding of the efforts we are making to advance conservation, the ways in which we continue to positively impact the environment, and how we continue to demonstrate to others how they can follow this lead.

It is reassuring to have such a dedicated and devoted group looking after every aspect of the Calgary Zoo's business—from the unwavering support of the volunteer Board of Trustees, to the hard-working staff, management and directors, to the always significant contributions of the many zoo volunteers—we are positioned to deliver the best possible experience to each visitor every day, and to continue the important conservation work the community has come to expect from the Calgary Zoo. ☐

*These are not true numbers of specimens as they include animals in large groups who are not individually counted but recorded for inventory as a group. For example, tilapia were displayed in two separate tanks—one in the Rainforest building and the other with the hippos in the Savannah—so are recorded as two individuals. ** Increase in invertebrates is due to the complete list of butterfly species we have had on display. The butterfly is rotational with species so the number of species can either go up or down throughout the year.
