



Zoovivor – Small group teambuilder

It is tribe against tribe in *Zoovivor*! This Zoo island adventure is much about team work and a willingness to have fun. Tribes will experience a series of Zoo-style challenges that will test mental stamina, creativity, cooperation, and individual and team attitude. As long as everyone is having fun and no one is creating any tribal tension, no one gets voted off the island!

POSSIBLE CHALLENGES

1. Pebbles and Penguins
 - Ever wondered how a penguin might impress a potential mate? It's all about getting the perfect pebble. A little speed and a lot of strategy will let you triumph at this game of stones.
2. What the Heck Is It?
 - You are presented with numerous, interesting biofacts (=animal artefacts). As a tribe, you will need to determine what each biofact is. So, what's your best guess?!!

Duration: typically 3 hours

Prices: (includes Zoo admission)

“Without a catered event” price: \$750 flat fee for up to 15 ppl

“Within a catered event” price: \$550 flat fee for up to 15 ppl

A catered event is an event with a full day room rental and a catered meal for a minimum of 30 people.

Minimum # of participants: 5

Maximum # of participants: 15

Booking: minimum of two weeks notice. To book with a banquet room and catering, please call 403-232-7770. To book without a banquet room and catering, please call 403-695-3806.

Venue type: both indoors and outdoors. In cases of severe weather, we will aim to reduce the time spent outside.

Dress code: wear comfortable clothes and shoes and be prepared for weather changes. Zoovivor is not a race but has a set timetable of activities and thus there is no need to run between challenge stations.

Basic Itinerary:

A staff member will meet you at your Zoovivor start location and provide an introduction to the activities, go over ground rules and the timing of the program. This usually takes 10-15 minutes.

Your group will split up into their teams of 3-5 people and be given a timetable and Zoo map. Teams will then make their way to their first challenge. Teams will be sent to different challenges, led by staff and volunteers. Each team will have a timetable outlining the start times and locations for each of the stations.

Each team will then proceed to a series of five challenges before returning to the main venue for wrap up. Individual teams will remain together in their cohorts of 3-5 people and arrive at any given challenge at the same time as one or two other teams.

At each of the challenge activities, the team will receive a score and their final tally will be counted at the end of the race as they return to the main room. Your race host will announce the winners and conduct an informal debrief of the events, what they learned, what they found most challenging, etc.
