Frequently Asked Questions

What is an endowment fund?

Simply put, an endowment is a pool of funds which are invested in perpetuity, so they can provide stable and ongoing financial resources towards a designated program or general operating costs of a charitable organization. Endowments are an important source of permanent, long-term funding to help organizations achieve their mission and mandate.

How is the Brian Keating Conservation Endowment Fund managed?

The Brian Keating Conservation Endowment Fund's investment goal is to achieve a long-term rate of return as established in the Endowment Policy, and to do so at the level of risk specified in the Investment Policy.

Each year, a Board-approved percentage of return is disbursed from the Endowment to support direct costs of our conservation programs anywhere in the world. To preserve the purchasing power of the Endowment, losses from market changes or inflation are accounted for before annual disbursements are made.

We engage the expertise of an investment management subsidiary of a major Canadian bank to implement our investment strategy in accordance with the Boardapproved Investment Policy.

Who is the Brian Keating Conservation Endowment Fund named for?

Brian Keating was the first person to hold the position of Head of Conservation Outreach at the Wilder Institute/ Calgary Zoo. Over a 30-year career, Brian raised significant funds for conservation programs, helping establish our reputation as a global leader in wildlife conservation.

How can I contribute to the Brian Keating Conservation Endowment Fund, and what are the benefits of giving?
